Clear Vision For Success: A Guide to Getting Optometry Support & Eyeglasses for Students


You spoke and we heard! One of the biggest requests from school nurses this year was help supporting students who fail their school eye exam. The school liaison team has been working hard on finding resources for students to connect them with optometry services and support for the purchase of glasses. Now it's time to share those resources with you!



Through your NASN/IASN membership, you have access to the VSP Eyes of Hope program. The program operates to provide access to eye care via "gift certificates" that can be ordered through the NASN membership page. Gift certificates cover a comprehensive eye exam and, if prescribed, new glasses at a VSP network doctor's office. NASN members can provide up to 10 students a year who qualify with a certificate to receive

essential vision care at no cost to the school or student. Coverage is printed on each certificate. The School Health team with FHD has put together a list of local VPS providers for you, as well as all the information you will need to be able to use this program through your FHD supported membership.

We know that not all students will fit into the qualifications for use of the VSP Eyes of Hope program, or you may find yourself with more than 10 students a year that need support. FHD has partnered with the Lions Club of Indiana to provide comprehensive eye exams and glasses, if prescribed, to those in need. The only qualifications for use is that the student does not currently have coverage through insurance or a government program for these services and that they have not used this program in the last 12 months. You will need to send an email to the FHD School Liaison Team with information about your student and we will email you back a voucher to print out to send home with your student (they will need a hard copy in hand for their appointment, an electronic copy will not be accepted). The student's guardian will need to follow the instructions on the voucher to set up an appointment for the student. These vouchers are only available for use at the Walmart Vision Center in Noblesville at 16865 Clover Road near 37 and Greenfield Avenue (phone number: 317-773-1981).
